TO BE IN THE PAINTING

- 1. I enjoy working on a large canvass. I feel more at home, more at ease, in a big area. Having the canvass on the floor, I feel nearer, more a part of the painting. This way I can walk around it, work from all four sides, and be in the painting. (Jackson Pollock)

- 3. *Mo'ed* an appointed time *Mikra kodesh* – a sacred assembly

Shabbat in Deuteronomy: "The seventh day is a sabbath to Adonai...Remember that you were slaves in Egypt and that Adonai your God brought you out of there..." (Deuteronomy 5:14-15)

Shabbat in Leviticus: God called (Vayikra) from the Tent of Meeting (Ohel Mo'ed) (Leviticus 1:1)

- 5. "Let them build for me a sanctuary (Mikdash) that I may dwell b'tocham. (Exodus 25:8)
