
- So Moses said, "Let me turn aside now and see this great spectacle why does the thorn bush not burn up?"

- 2. The Lord saw that he had turned to see, and God called to him from within the thorn bush, and He said, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am!"

- 3. Rashi: "Turn aside" does not mean just to turn, but to go in a new direction.
- 4. <u>Turn aside</u>: to defect, to engage in apostacy. *Asurah* which is from the verb סרה which is to turn aside, but also means elsewhere in *Tanach* to defect, or from prophets: engage in apostasy. Contains a disruption, subversion, a paradigm shift in a point of view. There is some kind of defecting from the path from before.

Deuteronomy 13:5 בֵּי דָבֵּר־ **סַרָה** עֲלֹ־ יָהוָֹה: "for he urged disloyalty to the Lord your God."

Deuteronomy 19:16 לַעֵבְוֹת בְּוֹ **סָרֵה:** "gives false testimony against him."

Isaiah 1:5 עוֹד תוֹסִיפוּ סָרָה כַּל־ רְאשׁ: "... that you continue to offend?

- 5. "What we lack is not a will to believe but a will to wonder. Having a sense of wonder, being able to appreciate the miraculous in everyday life, is the secret to finding the presence of God." Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel
- 6. "There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle." *Albert Einstein*
- 7. **Averted vision** involves using peripheral or side vision that allows you to see things outside of your direct line of sight. By "turning aside" a faint object can be observed.



8. The text describes a "bush" (Hebrew: sneh) on fire, yet the fire does not destroy it. The Talmudic Sages identified the plant as the holy blackberry, Rubus Sanctus (in Latin, sanctus and in Hebrew kadosh), a thorny bush with pink flowers, which reflects the belief that this was in fact the plant through which God first revealed Himself to Moses. "This (burning) bush produces both thorns and roses," our Sages taught (Shmot Rabba, 2:5), "just like the people of Israel that includes both righteous and wicked."



9. Baruch de Espinoza- **Blessed, from a thorny bush.** The Portuguese surname "Spinoza" means "thorny". Beauty is thorny, think of a rose. That is why Baruch de Spinoza designed this seal ring with his initials on the top, a thorny rose in the middle and the Latin word: "Caute" ("Beware") He used it to close his letters with wax seals. "From the thorn comes good; from the thorn comes a rose."
