## TO TURN ASIDE IS TO SEE MORE

- 1. פֿאָלר הַגָּדל הַגָּה אָת־הַמַּרְאָה אָת־הַמַּרְאָה הַגָּדל הַזָּה (Exodus 3:3) "Let me turn aside and I shall see this great sight..."
  - סרה to turn aside, to defect, to engage in apostacy
- 2. "Turn aside." This does not mean just to turn, but to go in a new direction. (Rashi)
- 3. "Who am I?" (Exodus 3:11)
- 4. "I will be with you." (Exodus 3:12)
