WHAT IS IT?

1. When the fall of dew lifted, there, over the surface of the wilderness, lay a fine and flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "*man hoo* [what is it]?" for they did not know what it was [*mah hoo*]. (Exodus 16:14-15)

Moses said to them, "That is the bread which God has given to you to eat." (Exodus 16:15)

The house of Israel named it manna [man]. (Exodus 16:31)

- 2. God gave you manna to eat, which neither you nor your ancestors had ever known, in order that you might know that a person does not live on bread alone but on whatever comes forth from God's mouth. (Deuteronomy 8:3)
- 3. Manna is both bread and not-bread...A substance that tells of the unknown leads the consumer to *see through* its flimsy appearance...the unknowable leads the traveler to an imaginative knowledge, which refigures, transfigures the world. (Avivah Zornberg, *Bewilderments*)
- 4. It all began with my painting a picture of an American flag...I went on to similar things like targets, things the mind already knows. I made the flags and targets to open people's eyes...they were both things which are seen and not looked at, examined. (Jasper Johns)
