THE ART OF INFINITE POSSIBILITIES

- וַיְהֵי יַעֲקֹב "Jacob lived..." (Genesis 47:28)
 חַיֵּי שֵׂרָה /"the life of Sarah..." (Genesis 23:1)
- After they had finished dinner, Rabbi Yitzhak said, "This is what Rabbi Yohanan said: Our father Jacob did not die." Rabbi Nachman said, "But surely there was eulogizing and embalming and burying him! Was it for nothing that they did this?" Rabbi Yitzhak said, "I am interpreting (*doreish*) a Biblical verse." (Talmud, Ta'anit 5b)
- "I will tell you what will happen in days to come [in the end of days/בָּאַחֵרִית הַיָּמִים]" (Genesis 49:1). He wished to reveal to them the end of all exiles, but the Shechinah departed from him, and he began to say other things. (Rashi)
