LIFE AND DEATH MERGING

1. When a woman תַּוְרִיצֵ and bears a male, she shall be *tamei* seven days...she shall not touch any consecrated thing nor enter the sanctuary until her period of purification is completed. (Leviticus 12:2-4)

זָרַע – to sow, scatter seed; produce seed;

"The earth brought forth vegetation: seed-bearing plants (מַוְרִיעַ זְבִע) of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it (וַרְעוֹרבוֹ). And God saw that this was good. (Genesis 1:12)

2. Overlay it [i.e., the ark] with *zahav tahor* (pure gold)... (Exodus 25:11)

- 3. According to [Mary] Douglas, Leviticus designates as sources of impurity not things that are *morally* sullied but things that by their very nature are unbounded and cannot be hemmed in....Leviticus prohibits in order to protect. The new mother is barred from entry to the Temple because the boundary-breaking experience of childbirth cannot translate neatly into a covenantal Temple framework...Childbirth is a process in which pleasure and pain, life and death, purity and impurity, are intermingled and become inextricable from each other.
